

I am a good worker and Bob is my best mate.


















I have been at Shepparton Access for over four years now and I love it.

Sometimes I play games. I throw the ball and splash Brett and anyone else who comes close enough.


I like talking to the life guards. Last week we talked about footy tipping. My team is Geelong and they always win.

Sometimes the staff have a special morning tea because it is someone's birthday.


The staff always say I have done a great job and thank me for my help for the morning.

Everyone says see you next week.


It is great.

Strength Training keeps me fit and healthy. It makes me feel good. It helps me lose weight.


After training we all have a cuppa and chat.

I like going to McDermotts to work a lot. I wear a red shirt with a logo and my name on the pocket. I also wear my work boots because they are safe.



We deliver the meals in Shepparton and Mooroopna. I like doing Meals on Wheels as we play jokes on each other.


When a new person joins Meals on Wheels I send them into the house in Hall Street. We watch the dog bark and show his teeth. The dog is really scary.
